

The Airspeed Oxford Project: The Momentum Continues!

Are you as excited as we are to see the Airspeed Oxford return to it's true glory? This oxford project takes attention to detail and some immaculate woodwork to rebuild the form and structure.

Work this summer continues on the cockpit floor structure. Assembly of all wood parts is mostly complete by our team of dedicated volunteers right here in Central Alberta. The next steps will be to prime and paint the cockpit floor, followed by attaching some of the parts ie: rudder pedals, control column, and seats. Over the winter our volunteer Dave K refurbished the rudder pedal assembly. Remember our Volunteer highlighted a few series ago, Shane Cockriel? Shane has mostly completed refurbishment of the control columns. He has now begun work on the throttle quadrant pedestal. This refurbishment of the oxford is being complete entirely by volunteers and their diligent research and diligence to the aircrafts details throughout the project.

In March, Vern D travelled to Australia and was able to visit several museums that are also restoring Airspeed Oxfords; a lot of good information shared. It was interesting that these museums have a similar passion with HHAS to capture and preserve the important history from this period of time within their regions. We encourage you to check out their projects as well!













Looking to join our team of volunteers? There are smaller components that just need cleaning and a bit of research as to their function in the aircraft. These are components that you may take to your personal workshop and see if you can bring them back to life. Often it's just cleaning-up corrosion or painting that they need or lubricating. Here are some of the upcoming items we will need on this project and the approximate values:



Airspeed Indicator	\$750
Sensitive Altimeter	\$580
Engine Tachometer	\$625
Tach cable (long)	\$100
Electric Turn and Bank indicator	\$880
Oil Press/temp gage	\$320
Com Radio antenna	\$180

Eventually we will need a prop (left hand screw) \$6100 and flying wires which are quoted at \$15,000
